



Hello Bonillas Families, Students and Friends,

The time has finally come to begin welcoming students back on campus to learn with their teachers in-person along with their classmates that are continuing their learning remotely. The Bonillas team made a commitment at the beginning of the school year to do everything possible to support our students and school community. With that in mind, the teachers of Bonillas voted to be a full simultaneous site. This means that students will keep their same teachers no matter if they are remote or in-person. This will allow for students to stay with their friends and teachers, continue relationships built and finish this school year together. I appreciate the continued community and parent support we have received throughout the school year. We are going to head into 4th quarter just as we started this school year, STRONG.

The upcoming week is going to be a learning experience for students, teachers and parents. I appreciate your flexibility and patience while we navigate through the Simultaneous Instruction Model, solidify schedules, and build classroom communities, both in-person and remotely. If you do have questions, please reach out to the classroom teacher or front office. We are here to assist you in this transition.

Below is some important information that will help you and your students' return to school. In addition, attached in this email is our district re-entry plan. This plan has been approved by central leadership for the re-opening of school.

March 22nd: First day of 4th Quarter for students in-person and online.

The following items will help you navigate through the in-person re-entry next week.

Arrival: Please ensure that your student arrives on time each day. All gates around the building will close at 8:30am. If your student is late, you will need to accompany them to the front doors to check in. Please view the diagram on page 4 to assist you with dropping off students. We ask that parents utilize either pull up bay. While we normally love having parents accompany students onto the playground, we are asking that you remain in your car.

Back packs: In order to lessen the number of items coming back and forth to school, students do not need a backpack for the remainder of the year.

Breakfast: All students at Bonillas receive free breakfast. We always enjoyed watching parents and students enjoy this time together. However, due to safety concerns, parents will not be able to participate in this.

Dismissal: As a result of keeping a closed campus, we had to rethink our morning drop off and afternoon pick up. We will utilize a curbside drop off and pickup method. This process is going to take patience during the first several days. Thank you for understanding and letting us improve the process. Parents are not permitted to park and walk up.

- **Kinder – 2nd Grade:** Parents will pick students up at the bay off of 17th Street. Staff will only be loading the **first three cars** at a time. We ask that all parents remain in their cars. Staff will load your student(s) on the right side of the vehicle.



- **3rd – 5th Grade:** Parents will proceed to the back north parking lot that will be a turn around model. Staff will only be loading the **first three cars** at a time. We ask that all parents remain in their cars. Staff will load your student(s) on the right side of the vehicle.
- **Mixed Grades:** If you have students in multiple grade levels, the older student will meet the younger student. For example: If you have a Kinder, 3rd and 5th grade, the 3rd and 5th grader will meet the kinder student at the south bay pick up.
- **Name Cards:** To assist with the process, we created laminated colored cards for your student. Please place these in the front window of your car when picking up students so staff can expedite the process.
- **Diagram:** Please refer to the below diagram to assist you.
- **Walking Home:** Students that walk home will exit through the front doors.

Email: Please make sure the front office and teacher has your updated email address as most of the information from the school will come out electronically.

Homework: While we understand how valuable homework is to the educational process, at this time we will not be issuing homework for students. We do encourage all students to please read for at least 20 minutes per night.

Laptops: If your student is returning to campus, please make sure they bring back their laptop and charging cable. Students will utilize technology in the classroom from time to time.

Lunch: All students at Bonillas receive free breakfast and lunch. There are no forms or additional documents to fill out. We highly recommend all families take part in this service to reduce the amount of lunch boxes exchanging from home to school. The free breakfast and lunch menu can be found at tusd1.org.

Masks: All members of the Bonillas community (teachers, administration, parents, students, district personal) are always required to wear masks in the building.

Social Media: Please take a moment to check out our Bonillas webpage for all parent letters, staff information as well as alerts from the district. In addition, we will share information via Facebook. You can 'like' us from your mobile device by looking for Bonillas Traditional Elementary Magnet School or #BTEMS.

Supplies: We have many supplies that we ordered prior to the beginning of the year. There is no need for you to send your student with supplies currently. The teachers have all items ready to go for our returning students.

Uniforms: With such a short amount of time left of school, we are holding off on uniforms for all students. Our normal dress code will be reinstated in August. For the remainder of the year, students can wear free dress to school, adhering to the TUSD Dress Code. Please make sure all students are in closed toed shoes, appropriate length shorts, covered midriffs and shoulders.

Visitors: We love having visitors at Bonillas, however currently we are not allowing any visitors or parents into the building. When checking a student out, parents will come to the front door and utilize



the doorbell intercom. The front office will bring the student to the door and validate the identity of the receiving person.

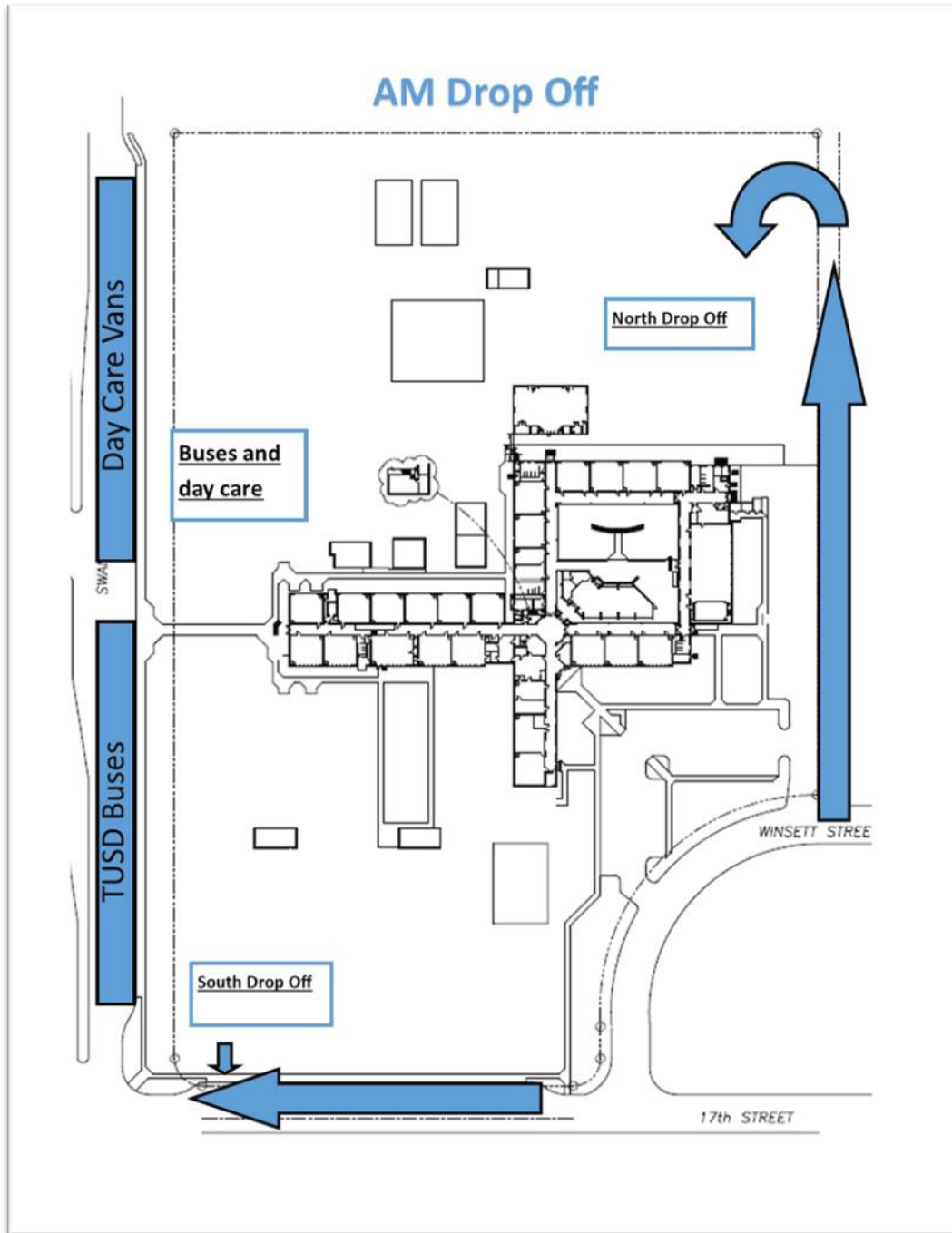
